Mission

Daughters of Worth provides trauma-informed, comprehensive services for girls and women who are victims of violence, specifically human trafficking and domestic violence. Through prevention education, safety planning, advocacy, case management, emergency support, and trauma-informed mental health services, Daughters of Worth empowers survivors to find hope for their lives and freedom for their futures.



Key Programs and Services

Daughters of Worth is the only organization in the region providing prevention education and serving girls and women of all ages who are survivors of human trafficking. Victim services include: safety planning, assisting survivors with a safe exit from their trafficker/abuser, advocacy, case management, documentation recovery, emergency support (including emergency shelter, medical care, food, clothing, hygiene items, household goods and childcare items), referrals to partnering agencies, and trauma-informed mental health services. In addition, Daughters of Worth partners with Juvenile Justice, recovery inpatient facilities, and the Pitt County Detention Center to provide group sessions, trafficking screenings, and case management for survivors.

- **GLAM Girls**-Through the **GLAM Girls** (*Girls Living a Mission*) program, Daughters of Worth provides prevention education and empowerment sessions for more than 500 girls in schools (elementary - high school) throughout Pitt, Beaufort, and Martin Counties. Participants are discovering how to create the tomorrow of their dreams while having their basic needs met today. Services are available completely free of charge.

Ways to be Involved

- **Facilitators** -·Serve an entire group of girls for 1-year, leading sessions in schools and building relationships with girls.
- **Advocates**- Work directly with our young ladies between the ages of 18-25, providing mentorship and support.
- **Emergency Services Team** - ·Deliver essential items directly to girls and young ladies in need.
- **Events & Fundraising Team** - We are seeking volunteers who are skilled at fundraising, event planning, and/or who are talented with décor and design.
- **Sponsor a girl for only \$20/month.**

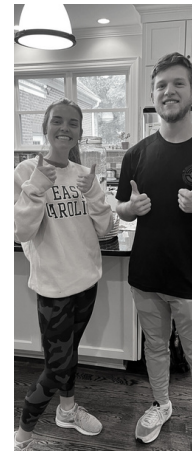

At CPC - we believe that all life is precious. We want to be the first resource women choose when facing an unplanned pregnancy.

Our Mission

To provide abortion alternatives, post abortion support, and sexual risk avoidance education with the hope of transforming lives through the grace of Jesus Christ.

Our Services

- **Pregnancy Testing** - We provide free pregnancy tests including options education for women (or couples) who are struggling to make a pregnancy decision.
- **Limited 1st Trimester Ultrasounds** - After receiving verification through CPC, our medical staff may be able to schedule a limited ultrasound to confirm the pregnancy.
- **Parenting Classes** - We offer a program designed to educate, equip, and empower our community's parents. Participation may continue until the child is 2 years old.
- **Maternity & Baby Boutique** - Points that clients earn from the parenting classes can be spent in the boutique.
- **Post Abortion Support** - We offer support to women struggling to navigate their post abortion experience.
- **Fatherhood Program** - We offer the 24/7 Dad program to support fathers.

- **Parenting Class Volunteers** - This person would be trained to review educational videos, with the client, answer questions, and discuss concerns that the client might have.
- **Administrative Volunteer** - This person would be trained to welcome clients who enter our building and to provide office assistance as needed.

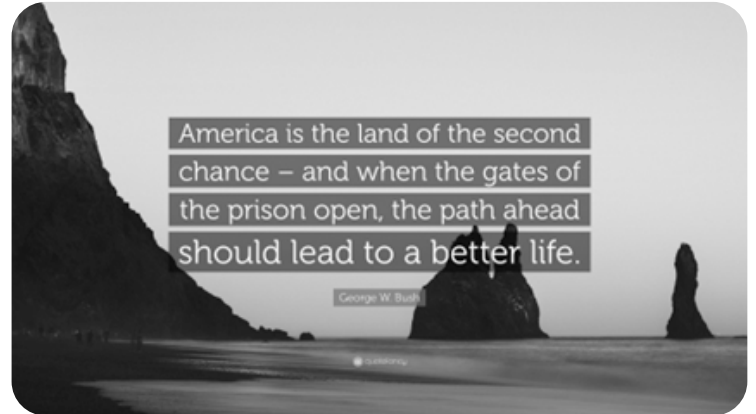

The Pitt County Local Reentry Council (LRC) believes that formerly incarcerated individuals can return back into the community and thrive if provided with the right support structure. Jobs, lodging, transportation and access to mental and physical healthcare are equally important factors for the formerly incarcerated when they return home.

In 2013, a calling to serve and a small grant gave way to a crucial mission: Feed the Children! Much of NE North Carolina has been labeled a “food desert” by the USDA, many of them minors. 86Hunger has made it their mission to reach as many of these children as possible with the help of the local food bank, schools, fundraisers and volunteers. As of 2021, 175 kids were fed weekly with more being added every year!

Oxford Houses of North Carolina, established in 1991, is a statewide network of recovery residences, chartered by Oxford House, Inc., the 501(c)(3) umbrella corporation. Oxford Houses are peer-driven, democratically run, and self-supported group residences for individuals in recovery from a substance use disorder. Currently, the network of Oxford Houses is over 3,300 in the United States.

Individuals typically enter an Oxford House after completing a treatment program or reentering from a correctional setting.

Basic House Rules

- **Houses operate democratically** –electing house officers who serve six-month terms.
- **Houses are financially self-supporting**—members split house expenses (which average \$110.00 to \$160.00 per person per week).
- *Any Resident who has a **recurrence** of the use of alcohol and/or illicit drugs must be immediately expelled.*
